

Union Day School





Mission Statement	Union Day School's community works together to provide students rigorous content and a rich curriculum that is parallel with the International Baccalaureate ideals of the learner profiles. We strive to build a nurturing environment where each student demonstrates a spirit of respect, responsibility, global mindedness and a commitment to academic and civic excellence.		
Community	Union Day School is a NC Public Charter School located in Union County, NC. The Population of Union County is 209,070 and UDS is conveniently located within 3 miles of Mecklenburg County, NC(population 1.14 million) and Charlotte, NC (population 897,000)		
School	Public charter high school Grades 9 –11. Accredited by the International Baccalaureate Organization. The high School will be adding one class of students each year with the first graduating class in 2026, 15 faculty members. Average class size 15.

International Baccalaureate Program	Union Day School has earned accreditation from the IBO and is the only charter school in NC to earn International Baccalaureate certification. Union Day offers two different IB programs. All IB students in grades nine and ten follow the IB Middle Years Program (MYP) curriculum. Grades eleven and twelve select to join either the IB Diploma Program (DP) or a certification curriculum. Students take advanced/college level classes in a variety of subjects. The DP Programme concludes with a series of rigorous examinations and preparation of a capstone essay or project depending on the program. The IB Diploma is internationally recognized, and the IB examinations can qualify students to earn college credits based on results.		
A.P. Courses	Union Day offers Advanced Placement® courses in English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Environmental Science, U.S. History, World History, Human Geography, US Government, Psychology, Computer Science Principles, Computer Science, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics, French Language, Spanish Language, German Language, Latin Literature, Music Theory & Studio Art through North Carolina Virtual Public Schools. Courses are awarded additional quality points and many are eligible for college credit.		
Honors Level Courses	Students can enroll in honors level sections of English 9, English 10, Common Core Math I, II and III, Earth & Environmental Science, Biology I, Physics I, Civics, and Economics and Personal Finance In addition, the following courses are awarded advanced credit: Pre-calculus;; Spanish III, IV, as well as numerous honors courses through North Carolina Virtual Public Schools.		
Career College Promise	Career and College Promise provides dual enrollment community college opportunities for Juniors and Seniors to accelerate completion of college certificates, diplomas, and associate degrees that lead to college transfer or provide entry level job readiness skills.		
E.C. Program	The Program for Exceptional Students is designed to offer a core curriculum using an inclusion model for students who have been identified as having special learning needs related to a disability. Additional support is provided by on-site case managers.		
Fine Arts Departments	Courses offered in the Fine Arts Department include Visual Art (Beginning, Intermediate, Proficient, and Advanced);; IB/MYP Art (Beginning and Intermediate); IB Art II and II		

NCVPS	NCVPS (North Carolina Virtual Public School) provides expanded academic options by offering online courses (AP®, Honors, World Languages, etc)
Class Rank	A 5.0 scale is used to calculate the GPA that determines class rank. Honors and MYP courses receive .5 extra quality points. College courses, AP and IB courses receive one extra quality point. Class rank is computed on six semesters at the end of junior year, again on seven semesters at the end of the first semester of the senior year, and a final calculation on eight semesters at graduation.

High School Diploma Requirement	Students are required to earn twenty-four credits for graduation. Credits must include English 1-4, Math 1-4, Earth/Environmental Science, Biology, a Physical Science, World History, Civic Literacy, American History and Economics and Personal Finance. Electives must include at least 2 classes that are art, world language or CTE. An additional 6 electives are also required.
